A candy maker in Indiana wanted to make a candy that would help us remember who Christmas is really about. He made a Christmas candy cane. He began with a stick of pure white, hard candy. White to symbolize the virgin birth and sinless nature of Jesus. Hard candy to symbolize the solid rock, the foundation of the church, and the firmness of the promises of God. The candy maker made the candy in the form of a

"J" to represent the name of Jesus. It also represented the staff of the "Good Shepherd". The candy maker then included three small stripes and a large red stripe to represent the suffering Jesus endured at the end of his life. The candy became known as a candy cane. Talk about the

legend. What did you learn? Who can you share this with?

Make it

Make some candy cane ornaments. Materials needed for one ornament:

1 red pipe cleaner 20-40 red and white beads

Begin by securing a bead at the bottom of the pipe cleaner by twisting the pipe cleaner tightly around the bead. Then "thread" the beads onto the pipe cleaner until you have it the length you like. Alternate the red and white beads so they resemble a candy cane. Secure another bead at the top in the same way as the bottom. Make a bend in the top of the candy cane and voila...You have a candy cane ornament!
