Worship Updates Related to COVID Restrictions

The Board of Elders met last week to discuss our worship practices in light of the improving situation with the pandemic. Below are some updates that will take effect this weekend. Additional changes will be announced as we work through the logistics.

Please note that these decisions are, of course, subject to change should the status of the pandemic and subsequent restrictions change.

Communion - Communion distribution will return to its proper place in the Order of Worship. We will practice "continuous communion" with worshipers returning to their seats afterward instead of filing out the door. This will be like the practice we used in the past for

holidays and special services. Communion will be served in a continuous line instead of by family grouping. The dismissal will be after everyone is served.

Prayer Requests - We will resume collecting prayer requests from those in the Sanctuary. Visitor/prayer cards are in the pews. Prayer requests will be collected during the Opening Hymn.

Offering - The offering will continue to be collected at the doors as we have for the past year. However, the offerings will now be brought forward during the Offertory. (Empty plates will still be at the door when you leave just in case you forgot on your way in.)

Children's Materials - The toddler bags have returned to the Kid Zone wall in the west corridor. Additionally, there are children's bulletins on the shelf above the toddler bags.



Lutheran Agency for Missions to Burmese (LAMB) has been working in the Burmese community in Fort Wayne since 2003. Established and led by Rev James Keller, it exists to raise up Burmese missionaries, teachers and pastors. LAMB works across ethnic, tribal and religious lines among the peoples of Burma living in the Fort Wayne area. The impact of this mission has been profound.

Rev. Keller and his family began work with the Burmese in 1998 while he was a student at Concordia Theological Seminary and doing his fieldwork at New Life Lutheran Church. He visited Asian markets, met Burmese refugees and learned Burmese from a Buddhist monk. He was ordained in 2001 and the following year established a bilingual service at New Life Church for the Burmese who were attending there. Since 2013 he has also served as the senior pastor at New Life Lutheran Church in southeast Fort Wayne.*

While this is great news, we also estimate that we will still have an outstanding debt balance at the end of next year between \$900 thousand to \$1 million.
